William A. Stanton assumed his position as Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Canberra, Australia on August 2, 2003. This followed assignments in the Department of State as Director of the Office of Egyptian and North African Affairs (2001-2003) and as Director of the Office of UN Political Affairs (1999-2001). A career Foreign Service Officer, Mr. Stanton returned to Washington in the summer of 1998 to participate in the Senior Seminar, the most advanced professional development program in the U.S. Government for foreign affairs and national security officials.

Mr. Stanton was promoted in 2002 to the rank of Minister-Counselor in the Senior Foreign Service. During his twenty-five year career in the Foreign Service, he has received three Superior Honor Awards, one superior group award, and three senior performance awards.

New York since September 11 has been marked by a sheer will to survive and to prove that survival was no fluke. Mr Stanton will be speaking on the effects of 9/11 on the city of New York and the implications it has had on the US government response to counter-terrorism. He will also delve into how 9/11 has affected the New York psyche.
